PETERSON PARK 6136 MISSION ROAD

MISSION

ANDERSEN PARK 5930 WEST 61ST STREET

Andersen Park was the first park Mission developed and is named in honor of former Mayor Victor X. Andersen. In 1956 the first Mission Municipal Swimming Pool was built in the park, and in 2014 it was replaced with the Mission Family Aquatic Center. The park includes two tennis courts, two picnic shelters with tables, two BBQ grills, a playground and a NEOS.

PRAIRIE VILLIAGE


FRANKLIN PARK ROE AVE. & SOMERSET DR.
