Public Works FacilityThe Public Works administration building was acquired by the City in 1997. Prior to this time, the 3-bay garage located behind the Public Works administration building had been Fairway's only Public Works Facility. Since 1997, new laws governing environmental protection have caused operational challenges for the Department. A recent space needs assessment conducted by the City showed deficiencies in the size and space of the facility, associated with inefficiencies in the Public Works operations (the current facility is one-third of the recommended size). Short term road closures on Buena Vista and delays in service delivery are just two examples. Rank this broad issue based on the overall Vision of the City.

Stormwater ManagementThe City of Fairway currently has 31 homes in the floodplain and experiences flooding on State Park Road and Brookridge Drive during major rain events. The City has undertaken stormwater projects in the past to address stormwater management. A Fairway Floodplain Committee was established in 2010 to continue to look at stormwater issues. A Rock Creek Watershed Coalition was also formed among cities in Northeast Johnson County in December 2012 and Johnson County is currently paying for 90% of a study to review previous stormwater management projects within the Rock Creek Watershed.
